

# Capture the Hatchery – D.C. Booth 2020 Photography Contest

## Photo Contest Rules

1. All digital photo submissions are welcome in one of three *entrant categories*:
  - a. **Professional** (persons that have charged for their photographs)
  - b. **Amateur** (persons that have not charged for their photographs)
  - c. **Youth** (persons under the age of 18)

Note: If participants do not indicate which category photos are intended for, submissions will be automatically included in the amateur category.

2. Each participant may submit up to three photographs per *theme* (i.e. maximum of nine entries per photographer):
  - a. **Wildlife & Nature**
  - b. **Scenic & Landscapes**
  - c. **People at the Hatchery**

**Note:** If the face of a minor under the age of 18 is pictured in a photo, an “Agreement for Use of Likeness in Audio/Visual Products” must accompany the entry. Forms can be found at <http://www.fws.gov/forms/3-2260.pdf>.

3. All digital photo contest entries must be taken on the grounds of the D.C. Booth National Fish Hatchery & Archives in Spearfish, SD. File size is limited to 5MB, JPEG format is preferred. Submit digital photos via email to [dcboothphotos@gmail.com](mailto:dcboothphotos@gmail.com) by July 7th, 2020 at the latest to be considered for the contest and prizes.
4. All contest entries will be retained by D.C. Booth National Fish Hatchery & Archives and may be used for a variety of reasons including, but not limited to publications, webpages, and presentations. Photo credit will be included on any images used for these purposes.

## Contest Judging

Photo submissions will be judged by members of the Booth Society Board of Directors and winners from each theme and entrant category will be awarded a prize from the Pond Gift Shop at D.C. Booth National Fish Hatchery & Archives. After receiving notification by email with details on how to collect their prizes, winners and their photography will be announced on social media.
